The mission of the Ned Smith Center for Nature and Art is to merge the worlds of nature and the arts, and to foster a celebration of both.

Trail: the 10K is rated 2+ and will include a railroad bed, dirt paths through woods with several hills. The 5K trail is rated 1+ and is on an old railroad bed and natural surfaces in the woods. This trail is new and does not go into town as did our previous events in Millersburg. The event is being held at the new Nature and Art Center named for the nationally recognized self trained wildlife artist, naturalist and writer Ned Smith. This Center includes a gift shop, original paintings, field sketches and changing exhibits of other artists. www.nedsmith@epix.net

Awards: There will be a "B" Award pin with Ned Smith logo. IVV credit is \$3.00, "B" Award and IVV Credit is \$5.00, or you may walk for free.

Directions: the Center is about a 1/2 hour drive from the intersection of I-81 and Routes 22/322. From the South of Harrisburg using Routes 11/15, I-81, or I-32 to Routes 22/322: Follow Routes 22/322 West along the Susquehanna River towards Clark's Ferry. Right before you cross the River, take Route 147 North to Millersburg. At the Millersburg Square, turn right onto Route 209 North. *After about 1 1/2 miles, turn right at Water Company Road and the Center will be on your right. From the North using I-80, Route 15 or Route 11: At Sunbury take Route 147 South toward Millersburg. At the Square take a left unto Route 209 North. Follow as above *. From the East using I-81 or I-78: Get on Route 209 heading West. You will pass a number of small towns. After Elizabethville with 8 miles to go, you will pass a Weis Market on your right and the next road on the left is Water Company Rd. Go left and the center is on your right. From the State College area following Routes 22/322: Immediately after crossing the Susquehanna River, turn right taking Route 147 North toward Halifax. Follow Route 147 thru Halifax to Millersburg. At the Square, turn right onto Route 209 North. And follow as above *.

The Atlantic Region Director in cooperation with the Riverfront Ramblers, AVA-0664 and the All American Walking Club, AVA-0906 will host the 4th Biennial Atlantic Region Conference on March 14 - 16, 2008 at the Holiday Inn — Martinsburg, Martinsburg, West Virginia.

A Registration Brochure containing all the information necessary to register for the conference is available on line at www.ava.org, then look under clubs, then VA. It also contains lodging, socials, events and other general information. Please join us for a weekend of activities and walking events. Learn about health and fitness, how the Atlantic Region operates, and maybe a little bit of West Virginia history. You can also just come to do the events.

ABOUT BERKELEY COUNTY AND MARTINSBURG

Berkeley is the second oldest county in West Virginia. The county was created by an act of the House of Burgesses in February 1772 from the northern third of Fredrick County (Virginia). Berkeley County was of strategic importance to both the North and the South during the American Civil War (1861 to 1865). The county, and Martinsburg, the county seat, lay at the northern edge of the Shenandoah Valley, and Martinsburg was very important because the main line of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad ran through the town. Martinsburg was close to the Union arsenal at Harpers Ferry. Control over Martinsburg changed hands many times during the war, especially prior to the Battle of Gettysburg in July 1863. After Gettysburg, the city remained mostly under Union control. Martinsburg was founded in 1778 by General Adam Stephen who named it in honor of Colonel Thomas Bryan Martin, a nephew of Thomas Fairfax, 6th Lord Fairfax of Cameron.

The award, designed by Indian Paintbrush Studios in Cheyenne Wyoming, is a 4" x 4" multi-colored ceramic tile. Fifty tiles are available for pre-registered walkers with reorders available, if necessary. You only need to complete one of the conference events to earn the award.

On-site registration opens at Noon, Friday, March 14 and will close at Noon, Sunday, March 16. Do not walk after dark.

Award: Award and Credit cost is \$8.00. Credit only is \$3.00

Some patches are available from 2006.

Trail Description: On-site registration will take place at the Friday Charles Town event; Saturday at the Martinsburg event, and Sunday at the Shepherdstown event. Driving directions to the start/finish will be provided upon registration. Trail will take participants through the Antietam National Battlefield. Trail surface is on natural paths — Union Advance Trail and the Final Attack Trail; plus hardtop on tour roads. Participants will need to pay National Park Service fee of \$3.00 per person or \$6.00 per family at the Park Visitor Center. Event will be held regardless of most weather conditions. Carry water. The trail [11km] from 2006 will be available if there has been considerable precipitation prior to the event dates. Places of Interest: The Battle of Antietam (or Sharpsburg) on September 17, 1862, climaxed the first of Confederate General Robert E. Lee's two attempts to carry the war into the North. About 40,000 Southerners were pitted against the 87,000-man Federal Army of the Potomac under General George B. McClellan. And when the fighting ended, the course of the American Civil War had been greatly altered.

Start Point: Asbury United Methodist Church, 110 W. North St, Charles Town, WV.

Start Time: Noon—3:00 PM. Finish by sundown.

Trail Description: The 10 KM trail, rated 2, follows sidewalks through the historic town of Charles Town, historic Edge Hill Cemetery, and Jefferson County Memorial Park. A 5 KM trail will be available. Places of Interest Charles Town is a picturesque collection of homes, churches, and public buildings. The town was founded in 1786 by an act of the Virginia Legislature on land provided by Charles Washington, youngest brother of the first President of the United States. Today, six homes built by the Washington family still stand, showing the first President's influence on the area. Visit the Zion Episcopal Church Cemetery in which the graves of 75 members of the Washington family as well as soldiers from the American Revolution & Civil War are found. Charles Town offers lots of history as well as a thriving down town with antique shops and restaurants. Jefferson County Courthouse is the site of the trials of William Blizard and John Brown.

Qualifies for AVA Special Programs: Cemeteries, Civil War, Courthouses, Railroad Heritage.

Directions: From I-81 in West Virginia take Exit 12 for WV-45/Winchester Avenue toward Charles Town. Turn left at Winchester Avenue/WV-45.

Start Time: 8:00 AM—11:00 AM. Finish by 2:00 PM.

Trail Description: The trail will be on the city streets and sidewalks in the oldest town in West Virginia. It will cover most of Shepherd College. It will include all of the historic downtown district with its collection of beautifully maintained homes and shops — a few of these buildings predate the American Revolution. This small town also played a part in the Civil War — as one resident put it “we were Confederate in the morning, Yankee in the afternoon and neutral ground in the evening”. Places of Interest: Shepherdstown is the oldest town in West Virginia and the site of James Rumsey's first successful demonstration of a steam powered boat in 1787. Shepherdstown was an open-air hospital during the Civil War, especially after the Battle of Antietam. It is home to the Contemporary American Theater Festival and the Rumsey Regatta Festival.

Qualifies for AVA Special Programs: College, Railroad Heritage.

Directions: From I-81 in West Virginia, take Exit 16 East in Martinsburg. Follow Route 45 towards Shepherdstown. In Shepherdstown, turn right at four way stop onto route 480, N. Duke St. The entrance to the Clarion is 0.25 miles on the right. (signs for WV-45 E/Charles Town/Harpers Ferry/Winchester Avenue) and continue to follow WV-45. Continue on WV-9 East. Turn right at Old WV-9. At Lancaster Circle, take the second exit onto Old WV-9 East. Turn right at North Street.

Eligible for the Courthouses in the USA, Riverwalk America, Cemetery Stoll, Authors and Literary Landmarks, and Railroad Heritage Programs.

LOCATION: Tunkhannock, organized in 1841, is the county seat of Wyoming County, which is 31 miles northwest of Wilkes-Barre and about 150 miles from Harrisburg. In the past, lumbering was carried on extensively. The chief industry was tanning and there were spool and tub factories, furnaces and machine shops, stave mills, and witch hazel distilleries.

Today, many residents are employed by the Proctor and Gamble plant nearby. As of the 2000 census, the borough population was 1,911. English translations of the Native American word Tunkhannock vary, including "meeting of the waters," "small stream," "wilderness stream," and "full of timber."

START/FINISH:

Gay's True Value Hardware
Route 6 and Bridge Street
Tunkhannock, PA

Please allow parking at the start point for customers. Follow directions to the parking area.

HOURS: 9:00 am to 3:00 pm

TRAIL: Walk goes through park along river, past historical buildings, courthouse, cemetery, old railroad bed on paved roads, sidewalks, roadside, and small amount of natural trail. Trail is doable for strollers but would be hard for wheelchairs.

AWARD: There is no award for this event.

Distance: about 140 miles from Harrisburg taking about 2 1/2 hours.

FEES: This event is Free to those who wish to participate without receipt of IVV credit. IVV credit only is \$3.00. There is no advanced registration.

GENERAL INFORMATION: Dogs are allowed, but they are NOT permitted in the start point, or any of the buildings along the trail. Dogs MUST be leashed at all times, and you must be prepared to pick up after your dog. **Restrooms are not available at the start point.** There are several fast food restaurants along Route 6 before entering Tunkhannock and one on Business Route 6 (Tioga Street) in town. There is one on the trail in the park along the river.

DIRECTIONS: From Wilkes-Barre or South: Take Exit 194 (Route 6) off of I-81. Follow Route 6 West to Tunkhannock. Turn right at Business Route 6 West to Bridge Street. Turn right on Bridge Street to Parking Sign on right which is across the street from the Post Office. After parking return to Bridge Street, turn left and walk two blocks to Gay's True Value Hardware store which is on the left before crossing the river.

From the North: Take Exit 194 (Route 6) off of I-81. Follow Route 6 West to Tunkhannock. Turn right at Business Route 6 West to Bridge Street. Turn right on Bridge Street to Parking Sign on right which is across the street from the Post Office. After parking return to Bridge Street, turn left and walk two blocks to Gay's True Value Hardware store which is on the left before crossing the river.
