

Directions to Courthouse Square Start Point Gazebo. Courthouse Square is the block bordered by N Main St, E Third St, N East St and E Second St.

From the South: Take US 15N * to PA 414W to PA 287N to US 6W to Coudersport. Turn right on N Main Street. Courthouse Square gazebo start point is on the right.

From the East: I-80W to US 15N, follow from * above

From: the West: Take US-6E to Coudersport. When US-6E turns left onto S. Main Street in Coudersport, go .2 mi to Courthouse Square gazebo start point on the right.

From the North: US 15S to US 6W to Coudersport. Turn right on N Main St. Courthouse Square gazebo start point is on the right.

SANCTIONED BY: This event is sanctioned by the American Volkssport Association (AVA), a member of the International Federation of Popular Sports. This event counts towards the acquisition of IVV Achievement awards.

PROCEDURE: AVA policy requires that every participant, fee or non-fee, sign the insurance waiver and obtain a numbered start card which is stamped at control points along the course. At the Finish, the validated card is turned in and IVV books are stamped for official credit, if the credit fee has been paid. The trail may be walked a second time on the same day using the same start card at no additional cost.

ELIGIBILITY: Everyone is welcome to participate. Children 12 and under must be accompanied by an adult. Walk at your own pace. Runners are welcome!

REGISTRATION and FEES: This event is free to those who wish to participate without IVV credit. IVV credit is \$3.00; IVV credit with "A" Award is \$6.00.. There is no pre-registration.

CONDITIONS: The event will be held regardless of the weather. There will be no littering. Wildlife and plant life are not to be disturbed. No refunds. Pets must be on a leash at all times and are not permitted in any buildings. Please clean up after your pet.

PARKING: Meter parking is free on Sunday and is available around Courthouse Square and along Main Street.

AWARD: The "A" Award is a 1" hat pin.

REFRESHMENTS: Food and beverages are available at various local businesses along the route.

RESTROOMS: Restrooms are available NEAR the start/finish and at occasional businesses along the way. **A RESTROOM STOP BEFORE ARRIVING AT THE START POINT IS ADVISABLE.**

Coudersport, PA is the county seat of Potter County, God's Country. Coudersport is nestled in the Endless Mountains and has many historic buildings.

TRAIL DESCRIPTION:

The 10K and 6K Trails Both routes include town sidewalks (some of which have uneven footing), streets, walking on dirt and gravel paths/roads, and a grassy area.. The 6K route would be suitable for large wheeled strollers.

Both routes cross the Allegheny River four times and pass a number of historic buildings.
